Bulk Trash Collection

Once a week on your Normal Collection

We are eliminating the twice a year cleanup and moving the Bulk Waste to once a week service. This service will allow you to place one large item out for pick up per week (in addition to your normal blue bag waste). Below are a list of items that are available for pick up and some of the items that are excluded.

1. All Bulk and regular household trash must be placed at the curb by 7:00am on your regular scheduled day to ensure pick up. Blue bag items will not be accepted as bulk, these must be placed in the appropriate blue bags.
2. Bulk waste must be generated from that household. Property owner cleanups and commercial establishments are not part of this agreement (these cleanups would have to be contracted through Veolia's Office).
3. Any large loose items such as rugs, carpet and padding must be in 4ft sections and bundled so one man can load.
4. Any items that contain moisture and cause disintegration or weight issues when wet, must be dry before pickup (items such as mattresses, cardboard boxes full of loose items).
5. Items must consist of a weight and size that one man can pick up.
6. Appliance pick up will be available twice a year Non Freon appliances no charge but must notify City or Veolia for pickup, \$20.00 for Freon appliances. The Appliance pick up times will be advertised in the Moberly Monitor Index. You are also welcome to bring these appliances to the Transfer Station throughout the year (\$5.00 Non Freon, \$20.00 Freon). Appliances that have had the compressor/Freon removed may be picked up at no charge only if the appliance has a manifest showing that the Freon was professionally removed.

Acceptable bulk items include, but are not limited to: televisions, couches, tables, chairs and other furniture, bed springs and mattresses (must be dry), carpet and carpet pads (4ft sections and bundled), lawn furniture, large discarded toys, swing sets (dismantled), barbecue grills (no propane tanks), sinks and bathroom furniture, lawn mowers (with oil and gas removed).

Unacceptable bulk items include: Construction or demolition including but not limited to: concrete, bricks, rock dirt, sheet rock, lumber and shingles. Other unacceptable items are: Batteries, tires, liquids (such as paint, gas or oil), yard waste, vegetation, burnt residue, ashes, or small metal pieces.

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
